McHugh Hall

LEED® Gold Certified Building

Formerly known as Laurel Hall, McHugh Hall was the first LEED Gold certified building on campus. McHugh is a centrally located academic building with 17 high-tech classrooms, hosting a variety of class subjects. A main green feature of the building is the 6,500 square-foot green roof garden, one of three on the UConn campus.

Year certified: 2013

First LEED Gold Certified new building at UConn

884 tons of construction waste diverted from landfill

Green features of interest:

- Energy-saving window glazing
- Low flow valves and faucets
- High performance insulation
- Use of rapidly renewable materials (i.e. bamboo and recycled copper)
- Green roof garden to reduce runoff and heating/cooling costs
- Bioswale and permeable pavers to reduce stormwater runoff
